

You will be participating in a hearing conducted by the Finnish Immigration Service via a video link from prison



Having a hearing via a video link means that the employee of the Finnish Immigration Service will be at the Finnish Immigration Service and you will participate in the interview via a video link from prison. The prison has set aside a separate room for the interview and the devices you need for the hearing.

Having a hearing via a video link does not affect the content of the hearing

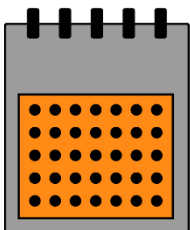


The hearing will have the same content regardless of if it is conducted via a video link or in person. We will hear you via a video link because you are in prison at the moment.

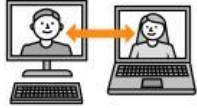
This is how you have a hearing via a video link



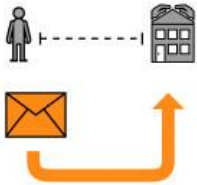
A prison employee will give you the Finnish Immigration Service's invitation to the hearing and instructions for it. The invitation tells you the date and time of the hearing.



On the day of the hearing, a prison employee will take you to the room reserved for it. They will tell you who can help you if you have problems during the hearing, for example with the video link.



We will contact you via a video link at the time given in the invitation. The invitation will tell you if an interpreter will be present at the hearing. The interpreter will use a video link.



We will check the hearing protocol with you via the video link. At that point, you can still make corrections or changes. We will post you two copies of the protocol to sign. You will receive a prepaid return envelope with the protocol. You need to sign the final page of both copies of the protocol. You will then put one copy in the return envelope and send it back to the Finnish Immigration Service. The other copy of the protocol is for you to keep.
