

RESIDENCE PERMIT APPLICATION FOR CHILD

This form is for you if you are applying for a first Finnish residence permit for a child under the age of 18 on the basis of family ties. The purpose of the application is that the child intends to move to Finland and to lead a family life with his/her guardian. The child must be unmarried for a residence permit to be granted on the basis of family ties between parent and child.

A clarification of family ties must be submitted with this form: a sponsor in Finland must use form PK4\_plus and a guardian with the child abroad must use form PH4\_plus. However, the clarification of family ties is not needed if the child is applying for a residence permit simultaneously with his/her guardian, or if the child was born in Finland and his/her foreign parents reside in Finland with a residence permit.

Carefully fill in and sign the application. Incomplete information will delay the processing of the application and may lead to its rejection.

An application may be submitted to a Finnish diplomatic mission abroad or at a service point of the Finnish Immigration Service in Finland. A processing fee will be collected when the application is submitted, according to the Decree on charges. Read the instructions for filling in the form at <a href="https://www.migri.fi">www.migri.fi</a>.

Clarifications that you need to append to your application are listed in Section F of this form.

#### 7 Processing fee

#### 9 Population register and personal identity code

When you are granted a residence permit by the Finnish Immigration Service, your personal information will by law in most cases be recorded in the *Population Information System*. You will also be issued a *personal identity code*.

The <u>Population Information System</u> is Finland's electronic population register. Its contents are available to all Finnish authorities. Some of the data can also be disclosed to private persons or entities. The register is kept by the Digital and Population Data Services Agency. The personal information in the register is stored permanently.

A <u>personal identity code</u> is a means of identification used in Finland. No two persons can have the same personal identity code. The code consists of 11 characters and is based on your date of birth and your gender (example: 131052-308T). Being issued a personal identity code gives you no rights or obligations in Finland. You will usually need it when you contact public authorities, because it gives them access to your information in the Population Information System. Also for instance employers, banks or phone operators may need to know your personal identity code.

At this stage, the following personal information will be recorded in the Population Information System: your name, gender, date of birth and your citizenship as well as your mother tongue, address and occupation.

You may also request a paper copy from the Finnish Immigration Service or from the Finnish mission (embassy or consulate) to which you return this application.
